First thing to know- anytime you post on social media, the objective is not to get sales. The objective should be generate interest. You want ppl to comment or do more than "like". So let's talk about sharing **You**. Ppl are fascinated by writers. Use social media to connect with your audience. The more they know and like you, the more they are likely to buy from you. Here is one approach:

- 1. Pick one part of your story to focus on for each post.
  - a. Don't tell your whole story at once (too long). Break it up. Example: one way writing has affected you, how publishing has affected you, or how you tackled a problem.
  - b. Be clear and concise.
  - c. Pay attention to your spacing (as writers we know the value of white space).:)
  - d. Emojis are good for emphasis; do not go overboard. Too many make it harder to read.
- 2. Have a call to action- what do you want ppl to do? Asking ppl to comment below won't always work for Facebook. This would be a good place to insert an emoji, then add "write below".

Note: FB and Instagram will not limit your words. To share on Twitter (280 characters), start your story, then post the link to Facebook for ppl to read the rest. Happy connecting!
