Hello NTers,

I hope the new month finds you well and productive.

I'd like to dive right in and address the issue of "Business as Usual."

As I said in January's letter, we are continuing to conduct business as usual—insofar as holding meetings, planning the next conference, and keeping our group running is business as usual.

But "Business as Usual" doesn't mean we don't care about what's happening at the National level or that we aren't taking the lessons to heart.

The events happening at RWA have rightfully sparked outrage and anger and multitude other emotions throughout the 9000+ membership roster. People are calling for answers and for change. Not an unreasonable expectation. But when people leave the organization because they don't want to be associated with it, that means there are fewer people left to affect that change and the progress of that change slows to a crawl.

But what does this all mean for NT? It means that NT should (and will) take a look at itself. It means we'll take action to address the issues. It means we put policies in place so that we are as welcoming on paper as I believe we are in person.

That's not business as usual. That's taking action to effect change. That's learning and growing as individuals and making sure our group continues to operate and to flourish.

To that end, *I'm issuing a call to action*—come be a part of the change we want to implement in our chapter. I'm asking for 3 to 5 members to form a DEI Committee to put together some policy and procedures in regards to diversity, equity, and inclusion. Shoot me an email at president@ntrwa.org to volunteer. I have some info and links to information that was gathered by several members, so there's a place to start. And thank you to those members—you know who you are.

I've also reached out to the board of W.O.R.D. about them becoming the clearing house for any ethical complaints by writers group members whose organizations are W.O.R.D. members. I've been invited to the W.O.R.D. Leadership Meeting on the 16th, so I'll be

NTRWA. A couple dozen of you are up for NT renewals either at the end of Jan or the end of February, and I don't know how that overlaps your RWA membership. I know it seems crazy to pay another \$100 to RWA when everything is still in flux, but NTRWA has options even should the catastrophic happen, and we want all of you to be a part of our landscape moving forward. Of course, the decision rests with you and what's best for you, but in case you missed it, RWA has issued grace periods for National and chapter-level dues:

National dues extension:

Members with a paid-through date of December 31, 2019, or January 31, 2020, have until March 31, 2020, to renew their RWA membership. We have emailed all members impacted by the extension.

Chapter dues extension:

Chapter members with a paid-through date of December 31, 2019, have until February 29, 2020, to pay their dues. Chapter members with a paid-through date of January 31, 2020, have until March 31, 2020. These chapter members have not been contacted. If your chapter would like for us to email these members, please email me and I will set this up.

This extension only allows extra time to pay the dues renewal invoice; the member's billing period does not change. For example, if someone has a paid-through date of December 31, 2019, and waits until March 28, 2020, to renew their national dues, their billing period would stay January 31, 2020, though December 31, 2020.



BOOK DESCRIPTIONS ON AMAZON

Ever wonder why your blurb for your paperbacks look different than your blurb's for your eBooks on Amazon?

Unfortunately, the book description of your paperback will need HTML tags in order to add spaces between paragraphs or making letters bold/italicized.

Example: for the beginning of a paragraph, and for the end of a paragraph.

To update your paperback's description:

- 1. Sign in to: https://kdp.amazon.com
- 2. Go to your Bookshelf and click the ellipsis button ("...") under the Paperback Actions menu next to your book.
- 3. Select "Edit Details"
- 4. Under Description, make the necessary edits using html code for breaks, bold, and italics.
- 5. Go to the bottom of the page and click "Save and Continue" and click thru.
- 6. On the book pricing & promotion page, click the publish button at the bottom of the page.
