

After a long hiatus from RWA and NT, I returned to find so many new faces. It has been a wonderful opportunity, and my pleasure, to learn about the current members of NT.

I hope each of you will find something new, something more, something deeper about your fellow chapter-mates.

If you could choose to do anything for a day, what would it be?

-Be at the Louvre all day and soak up the history and the art or spend Christmas at Disney with my entire family (we are Disney people)

My bucket list:

Travel to Italy, Australia, and Greece.

GET TRADITIONALLY PUBLISHED (with a publisher from my target list.)

Win the lottery so I can travel to Italy, Australia, and Greece.

Kodak moments – memories – live vividly in a writer's mind: describe a favorite coffee shop, wine house, or café? Where is this location?

-All About Cha, in Southlake. My critique group meets there and both the staff and the food are wonderful. I go there by myself sometimes to write because I love the ambiance.

Authors who inspires you? Why?

-I always have, even when little. Now I write with a goal in mind (publication.)

How have your life experiences influenced your writing?

-I grew up an Army brat and changed schools every year from Kindergarten through 5th

Plotter or Pantser?

-I think of myself as a Pantser, but I'm actually a Plantser. I know the GMC of the hero and heroine, I develop the beginning and end and some key points that have to occur in the middle of a book before I start writing, and then I GO.

When is your favorite time, of day, to write?

-Morning. Hands down. I'm useless in the evening.

If you could have a personal one-on-one conversation with any person – fictional or real – who would it be? What is one question that you would ask?

-Eleanor of Aquitaine. She was the queen of two countries (France and England), she had thirteen children (most became kings / queens / nobles themselves), and she held her own with other powerful people at a time when women didn't traditionally do such things. My question to her would be, "What in your upbringing prepared you for the life you led?" I want her GM (I know her conflict--her husband, Henry)

What is something that you wished you had learned earlier in life?

-To say "No" when asked to volunteer for something I truly don't have the time to do in a way I'd like to do it.

Do you write to music? What type?

-I have a playlist for each book (a song per chapter reflecting the mood / tone I'm going for in the chapter) and I only listen to the playlist during edits.

Do you write early in the morning? Late at night? All day long?

-In an ideal world, early in the morning. Life rarely works that way, so morning through early afternoon.

What's the hardest thing – to you – about writing?

-THE GREAT SOGGY MIDDLE OF THE BOOK. I love to start books and wrap-up the books at the end, but I hate the middle.

Do you currently – or in the past – work in a field not related to writing?
In another life-time, I worked as a Human Resources Director.

Is there an interesting story that you can share about that field?

I have a lot of weird stories from that experience, most notable was discovering a camera in the ceiling of the women's restroom and dealing with the case resulting from the discovery.

What brings you joy?

-My family and friends and community and the ability to express myself creatively.
